### ORDER OF NOTICE

On March 14, 2008, Northern Utilities, Inc. (Northern) filed with the Commission its Cost of Gas (COG) rates for the period May 1, 2008 through October 31, 2008 (2008 Summer Season). Included in the filing were revised tariff pages and supporting materials for the changed rates.

The proposed residential COG rate is \$1.1096 per therm, a \$0.2812 per therm increase from the weighted residential COG rate of \$0.8284 per therm for last summer. The estimated impact of the proposed firm sales COG and current LDAC rate on a typical residential heating customer's summer bill is an increase of approximately \$87, or 19%, compared to last summer. The current (winter) residential COG rate is \$1.0610 per therm and comparing the November 2006 through October 2007 gas cost of \$2,109 to the November 2007 through October 2008 actual and projected gas cost of \$1,915 for a typical residential heating, there is an overall decrease in annual costs of \$194, or 9%.

The proposed commercial/industrial low winter use COG is \$1.0887 per therm and the proposed commercial/industrial high winter use COG is \$1.1667 per therm. The rate increase for the commercial/industrial customers over the comparable 2007 Summer Season and current (winter) rates is commensurate with the residential COG rate increase.

The filing raises, *inter alia*, issues related to: RSA 378 relative to the justness and reasonableness of rates, forecasting of sales, supplier prices and transportation prices, purchasing decisions related to the current and past summer supplies and capacity, cost allocations between the New Hampshire and Maine divisions, the causes and treatment of any over and under recoveries, the reconciliation of prior period costs and revenues, what constitutes unaccounted for gas volumes and what is a reasonable level of unaccounted for gas volumes, and rate impacts. Each party has the right to have an attorney represent them at their own expense.

Defenseman Aaron Ward said that when Bergeron first started coming around again, he was pale and gaunt. "He looked like he was in a haze," Ward said.

His hands are back. He looks like a hockey player, not a guy who's trying to come back from an injury," Ward said. "All you hope for is progress."

Bergeron said this week he would like to put on another 10 pounds of muscle to get back to his playing weight of about 195 pounds. He also needs to recapture the timing that helped make him one of the NHL's most promising young players.

Whether he can pull that all together in time for the playoffs, the Bruins aren't willing to guess.

"We're not going to gamble with this guy," said coach Claude Julien, whose team is one of four fighting for the last four spots in the Eastern Conference. "There's no chance to be taking. When he comes back it will be because he's totally cleared and he's 100 percent and there's no risk involved."

In hockey, though, there's always risk.

Bergeron has spoken to former MVP Eric Lindros and Hall of Famer Michel Goulet, both forced into retirement by concussions, and ex-Bruins great Cam Neely, his career curtailed by a knee injury.

"That's the risk you take when you step out on the ice," Bergeron said, insisting he was never concerned the injury could be career-ending. "It never crossed my mind. I know I'll be back. I'll be back as soon as I can. Whatever happens, it's going to be the best for me, and I hope it will be this year."
