PWW has asked for an immediate increase of 11.27% and an overall increase of 25.27%. PWW's request for this increase is based on the cost to upgrade the water treatment plant and to ensure continued compliance with the Safe Drinking Water Act as well as other increased capital and operating costs. The increase would apply only to PWW's general metered rates as follows:
