

I am compelled to protest the proposed astronomical rate increases by the legally-sanctioned monopoly, Aquarion Water Co. of New Hampshire. Isnt the company in New Hampshire part of a larger conglomerate located in Connecticut?

Let me just say that we need to break up the water monopoly on the model of the telephone company-AT&T.
