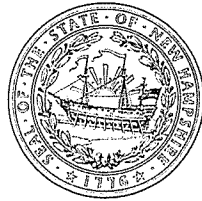

Re: DE 08-118, John G. Haven's Certification Application for Class II Eligibility

Dear Mr. Haven:

On September 16, 2008, you submitted an application requesting certification of your solar photovoltaic facility as eligible to produce Class II renewable energy certificates (RECs) pursuant to RSA 362-F, New Hampshire's Electric Renewable Portfolio Standard law.

After you submitted your application, Staff learned that you did not install a revenue quality meter that would allow the New Hampshire Electric Cooperative (NHEC) to verify and monitor your facility's output. In August 2009, Thomas Palma of NHEC notified Staff that you are no longer interested in installing such a meter and are not interested in pursuing your application for Class II eligibility. Accordingly, the Commission considers your application withdrawn and has closed the above referenced docket without prejudice.
