

Re: DW-08-160 Forest Edge Water Co.

Dear Ms. Howland,

I have rec'd a copy of Mark A. Naylor's letter dated Nov. 1, 2011. I have shared Mr Naylor's letter with the other Forest Edge I homeowners and our comments are as follows:

A. The homeowners agree with the PUC staff position that there should not be a rate adjustment at this time to cover the costs for Atlantic Operating and Management Corp.

B. With regard to extend by one year the time in which to seek a step adjustment for capital improvements, the homeowners think additional information should be collected before this request is granted. Under the

settlement agreement, capital improvements were to be completed by the end of 2011. One proposed improvement was to remove the upper well house and transfer (and up grade) the equipment to the middle well house. It is the homeowner's understanding that the Water Co. has decided not to do this. Rather the Water Co. has done work on the upper well house and this work is now complete. So the question is what capital improvements does the Water Co. propose to do if there is a one year extension? An extension should not be granted until there is some understanding of what capital improvements will be done.

Thank you for your consideration in these matters.
