Dear Secretary Howland:

In Order No. 25,123 issued in this docket on June 28, 2010, the Commission reviewed and approved the settlement agreement entered into by and between Commission Staff, the Office of Consumer Advocate, and PSNH.

Paragraph 14.4 of the settlement agreement provides as follows:

14.4 PSNH will annually file a report on executive compensation in the same format and with the same type of information as required in Connecticut for that state's regulated utilities. *See* CT DPUC Order in Docket 08-01-16, Petition of Richard Blumenthal, Attorney General for the State of Connecticut, for Standardized Disclosure of Utility Executive and Officers Compensation, dated December 3, 2008.

In Order No. 25,123, the Commission ordered "that the report on executive compensation shall be filed annually on or before August 1 each year for the preceding fiscal year ended June 30 and that the first such report shall be filed on or before August 1, 2010." To eliminate reporting difficulties that have been encountered resulting from the need to determine pension values and certain other compensation on a split year basis, the parties to the settlement (Staff, OCA and PSNH) have discussed this reporting requirement, and have agreed that this report could be filed on a calendar year basis, rather than on a fiscal year basis. PSNH respectfully requests that the Commission accept the parties' agreement on this slight change to the reporting requirement. Further, PSNH proposes that the annual filing date be accelerated to April 30 of each year as a result of the change to the compensation reporting period.



In compliance with the settlement agreement, attached hereto is PSNH's report on executive compensation in the same format and with the same type of information as required in Connecticut for that state's regulated utilities.

PSNH appreciates the cooperation of Staff and the OCA in this matter.
