On April 7, 2010, PWW filed a notice of intent to increase its rates. On May 7, 2010, PWW filed its schedules, pursu-ant to N.H. Code Admin. R. Chapter Puc 1600, as well as materials supporting its proposed rate increase and a petition for temporary rates. PWW seeks a permanent increase in its annual gross operating revenues of 33,916,175, an increase of 16.23%. In addition to the permanent increase in revenues, PWW is requesting a step ad-justment to recover plant additions to be placed in service during 2010. The pro-posed additional revenues for the step in-crease total \$886,639, which would bring the combined increase to 19,91%. PWW proposes to collect revenues from each customer class in accordance with its most recent Cost of Service Study, dated April 2010. The proposed combined per-manent and step rate increases for general metered customers, a 21.79% increase for pri-

metered customers, a 21.79% increase for pri-vate protection customers, an 8.23% in-crease for municipal hydrants, a 63.72% increase for its Anheuser-Busch contract, a 29.23% increase for the Milford contract volumetric charges, and a reduction of 2.4% for the Hudson Contract volumetric charges as a same collection. 2.4% for the Hudson Contract volumetric charges. As a result of the total proposed increase in revenue, PWW projects that an average residential customer's water bill with annual usage of 94.56 hundred cubic feet, or approximately 193 gallons per day, will increase from \$492.36 per year to \$608.40, or \$9.67 per month. PWW also seeks approval of a Water In-vestment and Conservation Adjustment (WICA) surcharge to cover the replace-ment and rehabilitation of water main, water services, water gate valves fire

water services, water gate valves, fir hydrants, and water meters. This WICA charge, if approved, would allow PWW to increase its rates annually up to a maximum of 2% per year, and no more that 7.5% between rate cases. PWW proposes that the first year of the WICA program be 2011.

PWWs filing also requests recovery of costs related to its defense of the City of Nashua's eminent domain action. PWW seeks to amortize into rates approximate-ly \$5.3 million over a ten-year period.

y \$5.3 million over a ten-year period, with a pro forma adjustment in this rate case of \$536,101. PWW also seeks a temporary increase to its rates during the investigation of its proposed permanent rate increase which, if approved, would result in a termorary increase in operating revenues which, if approved, would result in a temporary increase in operating revenues of \$2,604,524, or an overall increase of 10.80%.
