Dear Ms. Howland:

The Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA) filed a Motion to Limit Scope of Proceeding today. The OCA indicated that Staff did not concur. The reason, as explained to OCA, was that Staff views this motion as premature.

It is conceivable that issues in Docket No. DW 04-048 resolve themselves sufficiently and timely enough to include the eminent domain expense issue in the instant rate case. In Docket No. DW 04-048, the City of Nashua and the Pennichuck Companies have requested an extension until November 30, 2010 to report on whether the two parties have reached a settlement. If so, Pennichuck Water Works, Inc. will not pursue recovery of eminent domain expenses. Until that report, Staff believes removing the issue of recovery of eminent domain expenses from the instant docket is premature.
