Procedural Schedule

To the Parties:

On October 15, 2010, the Commission held a duly noticed prehearing conference in the above referenced proceeding. Appearances were entered by representatives of Public Service Company of New Hampshire, Ltd., Unitil Energy Systems, Inc., Granite State Electric Company d/b/a National Grid, New Hampshire Electric Cooperative, TransCanada Power Marketing, Office of Energy and Planning, the Office of the Consumer Advocate (participating as a full statutory party), and Commission Staff. Constellation Energy Commodities Group, Inc. and Constellation NewEnergy, Inc. timely filed for intervention but did not attend the prehearing conference. All pending intervention requests were granted.

Following the prehearing conference, the parties and Staff met in a technical session and agreed upon the following schedule which was submitted to the Commission for approval on October 20, 2010:

Parties to exchange sample disclosure labels

among Staff and the parties by October 22, 2010

Technical Session/Conference Call to discuss content and appearance of disclosure label

October 28, 2010, 9:00 AM

Technical Session/Conference Call to discuss whether to recommend rulemaking or other proceeding

November 22, 2010, 1:00 PM

Report and Recommendation to Commission Dece

December 1, 2010

The Commission has determined that the proposed schedule is in the public interest and therefore has approved it.

Along with its proposed procedural schedule, the parties and Staff requested the Commission make all competitive electric suppliers mandatory parties to this proceeding. Inasmuch as all providers of electricity are subject to RSA 378:49, requiring disclosure of environmental characteristics of the energy sources they use to provide electric service in the format established by the Commission, the Commission has determined that making such suppliers mandatory parties is unnecessary at this time.

For administrative efficiency, the Commission has elected to issue this Secretarial Letter as its prehearing order in this proceeding.
