CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Good afternoon.

We're here in Docket DT 11-061, regarding a

Telecommunications Relay Service Fund as a

substitute for certain FairPoint Wholesale

Performance Plan incentive payments. That's

from Staff's memo on this topic.

We're here for a public comment hearing, because the Legislature eliminated the fund where payments were going before. We need to decide what to do with the money now.

Mr. Wiesner, you want to set the scene a little bit for us.

MR. WIESNER: That was a good summary, Mr. Chairman. In 2014, the Commission issued orders approving a Wholesale Performance Plan that was developed through a stakeholder process with FairPoint, and filed with the Commission with a Settlement Agreement. In that order, the Commission directed that, if there were bill credits due to CLECs, which the CLECs had waived through commercial contracts, that FairPoint would nonetheless make payments as an enforcement mechanism to assure

compliance with the Wholesale Performance Plan, and, as you noted, designated that those payments would be made to the Telecommunications Planning and Development Fund, which has now been terminated by recent legislation.

Staff proposed that the
Telecommunications Relay Service Fund would be
an appropriate fund substitute recipient for
those payments. And today's public comment
hearing is to see if that is a proposal which
the Commission should adopt.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: There was a secretarial letter issued on July 21st. It scheduled this event. It also provides that written comments can be submitted until August 11th, 2017.

MR. WIESNER: That's correct. And yesterday, Mr. Ladam, Director of Regulatory Innovation & Strategy for the Commission, with responsibility for telecommunications matters, filed a memo in support of the TRS Fund as a substitute recipient.
