On September 23,2011, Public Service Company of New Hampshire (PSNH or Company) filed a petition to establish its default energy service (ES) rate for effect with service rendered on and after January 1, 2012. Pursuant to RSA 369-Bi3, IV(b)(I)(A), customers who take ES from PSNH will be billed at a rate equal to PSNHs actual, prudent and reasonable costs of providing the power, as approved by the Commission. In support of its petition, PSNH filed the testimony of Robert A. Baumann with related exhibits and schedules

According to PSNH, the ES cost categories in the filing are consistent with prior energy ES filings with one potential major addition- the status of which will updated prior to hearing. PSNH, stated that its ES cost categories include the revenue requirements for owned generation assets and the cost of purchased power obligations, including the firel costs associated with its generation assets, the costs from supplemental energy and capacity purchases, certain ISO-New England ancillary service charges, and the cost of compliance with New Hampshire's Renewable Portfolio Standard (RPS) and the Regional Greenhouse Gas Inflative (RGGI). PSNH stated that the generation revenue requirements include non-fuel costs of generation including non-fuel peration and maintenance costs, alexated alministrative and general costs, depreciation, property taxes, payroll taxes and a return on the net investment in its fossil and hydrogenical costs reperations plants.

PSNH said that the major addition to the calculation of its ES rate that will require an update are costs associated with the wet fine gas desulphurization. (FGD) technology (scrubber) project at Merrimack Station. PSNH said that it did not include any costs associated with the project in the instant filing and that following the testing of the scrubber equipment, it will have a clearer understanding as to the scrubber's in-service date. PSNH stated that it will provide an updated ES rate once the project is placed in service, which will be when the FGD is operating and reducing emissions at Merrimack Station. In this filing, PSNH provided its preliminary calculation of an ES rate of \$0.0839 per kilowatt-hour (kWh) for effect beginning January 1, 2012. On September 23,2011. Public Service Company of New Hampshire (PSNH) or Company) filed a petition to adjust its Stranded Cost Recovery Charge (SCRC) for effect with service rendered on and after January 1, 2012. In support of its petition, PSNH filed the testimony ofkobert A Baumann with related exhibits and attachments.

The SCRC recovery mechanism was established pursuant to the Agreement to Settle PSNH Restructuring Agreement, According to the petition, the Restructuring Agreement and agreement defined PSNHs stranded costs and categorized them into three different parts Part 1, Part 2 and Part 3. The SCRC was established to recover costs for all three Parts. The Restructuring Agreement capped the SCRC at an overall average rate of 3.40 cents per kilowatt- hour (RWh).

PSNH said that Part 3 costs were fully recovered in June 2006. The Restructuring agreement states that once Part 3 costs are fully recovered, the SCRC will be set on a forecasted basis every six months and will include any west-or under recover.

and will include any over- or under-recovered of Part 1 and Part 2 stranded costs from the previous period. Part 1 is composed of the Rafe Reduction Bond (RRB) charge, which is calculated to recover the principal net interest and fees related to RRBs. Part 2 costs are "ongoing" stranded costs consisting primarily office over market value of energy purchased from independent power producers (IPPs) and the amortization of payments previously made for IPP buy-downs and buy-outs as approved by the Commission.

Pursuant to Order No. 25,241 (June 28, 2011), PSNH is currently billing an average SCRC rate of \$0.0109 per kWh for the six-month period from July 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011. Based on the data available at the time offthe filing offthe instant petition, PSNH offered its preliminary calculation of an average SCRC rate of \$0.016 per kWh for service rendered on and after January 1, 2012. PSNH attributed the increase in the estimated average 2012 SCRC rate to a lower prior period over-recovery seconding the organized ower credits associated with accument SCRC rate (an increase in the ongoing costs perfaining to the RRBs due to lower credits associated with accumulated deferred income taxes. According to the petition, the Restructuring Agreement defined PSNH's stranded costs and categorized them into three different parts-Part 1. Part 2 and Part 3. The SCRC was established to recover costs for all three Parts. The Restructuring Agreement capped the SCRC at an overall average rate of 3.40 cents per kilowatt- hour [kWh]

PSNH said that Part 3 costs were fully recovered in June 2006. The Restructuring Agreement states that once Part 3.
