Mr. Ware is a frequent presenter at New England Water Works conferences. Experience

Mr. Ware has been Vice President, Engineering of Pennichuck Corporation since 1995. Mr. Ware is responsible for providing engineering support to the Companies utility operations.

Mr. Ware is responsible for planning, designing, estimating and overseeing the construction of Pennichuck's major utility capital projects.

During his tenure at Pennichuck Mr. Ware has designed ten pumping stations and the upgrading of over a dozen pumping stations.

Mr. Ware has designed softening, radon removal and green sand filtration facilities for some of the 50 Community Water Systems that Pennichuck owns.

Mr. Ware has designed over 15 miles of replacement or relining of water main during the last ten years.

Mr. Ware has also designed ten standpipes and/or ground reservoirs ranging in size from 150,000 to 6,700,000 gallons in capacity.

Mr. Ware developed Pennichuck's hydraulic model of its distribution system on Cybernet.

Mr. Ware is currently in the process of overseeing the design of a major upgrade to Pennichuck's 35 MGD Water Treatment plan order to insure compliance with the IESWTR.

Mr. Ware was responsible for overseeing the development of Pennichuck's watershed program, including the development of watershed ordinances within two of the five communities that overlay the Pennichuck Watershed.

Prior to his work for Pennichuck Corporation, Mr. Ware served as General Manager of the Augusta Water District in Augusta, Maine for nine years. Mr. Ware was responsible for all facets of the operation and maintenance of the Water District. The Water District employed 26 people and served just over 2 million gallons of water per day to 5800 customers.



CHAPTERS 236, 237.

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CHAPTER 236.

AN ACT TO SEVER THE FARM OF GEORGE W. SAWYER FROM SCHOOL-DISTRICT NO. 3 IN TUFTONBOROUGH, AND ANNEX THE SAME TO DISTRICT NO. 5 IN OSSIPEE, FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES.

SECT.

1. School-district lines changed.

SECT.

2. Takes effect—when.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

SECT. 1. That the farm of George W. Sawyer in school-district No. 3 in Tuftonborough be disannexed from said school-district No. 3, and annexed to school-district No. 5 in the town of Ossipee, for school purposes.

School-district lines changed.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

CHAPTER 237.

AN ACT IN AMENDMENT OF THE CHARTER OF THE PENNICHUCK WATERWORKS.

SECT.

1. Capital stock and real estate.
2. Dams and damages.

SECT.

3. Crossing highway.
4. Takes effect—when.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

SECT. 1. That said water-works may from time to time increase its capital stock to an amount not exceeding three hundred thousand dollars, and may purchase and hold real estate to an amount in value not exceeding fifty thousand dollars.

Capital stock and real estate.

SECT. 2. That for the purpose of furnishing an adequate supply of water for the use of the city of Nashua, its inhabitants, and for other purposes, said corporation is authorized to construct, enlarge, and maintain such dams, reservoirs, and other works as it may deem necessary and proper across and upon the Pennichuck brook, across or upon any brooks or ponds tributary to the same, and to enter upon and appropriate such land as may be necessary and convenient for the construction and use of the same, upon depositing with the clerk of the supreme court for the county of Hillsborough such sum of money as security for the payment of damages for the same as said court in term time or any justice thereof in vacation may order in case said corporation has not agreed with the owners thereof upon the damages and paid the same; and in case said corporation shall not agree with the owners thereof for the damage that has been or may be done by said corporation by reason of the erection of any dam on said brooks and the flowage caused thereby,

or in the exercise of any rights hereby granted, or such owners shall be unknown, either party may apply to the supreme court at the trial term thereof to have the damages determined, and said court shall refer the same to the county commissioners, who shall appoint a time and place of hearing, and give notice thereof in the same manner as is now required by law for laying out highways, and said commissioners shall make a report to said court, upon which the court may make such order as justice requires. If either party shall desire, upon application to said court before such reference, they shall be entitled to a trial by jury in such manner and under such regulations as said court may prescribe.

SECT. 3. That for the purpose of constructing or enlarging reservoirs of water for the purposes mentioned in the preceding section, said corporation may, at its own expense, raise the grade of any highway crossing said Pennickmuck brook, or its tributary brooks or ponds, upon giving thirty days' notice to the city or town in which the same may be located of its intention so to do, unless the county commissioners to whom application may be made within said thirty days by such city or town shall be of the opinion that such raising of grade would be injurious to public travel; and all damages occasioned to the owners of adjoining estates, or to any town or city, by such raising of grade, unless agreed upon by the parties, shall be determined as in the case of raising the grade in repairing highways, and paid by said corporation to such owners.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

CHAPTER 238.

AN ACT IN AMENDMENT OF AN ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE HILLSBOROUGH SAVINGS-BANK," PASSED JUNE SESSION, 1869.

First meeting.

SECT. 2. That section 8 of said act be so amended that Ammi Smith, S. Dow Wyman, Cornelius Cooledge, James S. Butler, Samuel J. Tilton, Jacob B. Whittemore, or any two of them, may call the first meeting of said corporation, as provided for in said act.


In accordance with your request, your Department of the Army permit, number NH-MASO-81-235, is hereby extended until December 21, 2009 provided you are agreeable to the modified special conditions contained below. This work is located in the Merrimack River at your intake facility in Merrimack. The work involves the installation and operation of a water withdrawal intake from the Merrimack River to supplement your water supply.

Special Condition 1. Diversion of up to 30 million gallons per day (MGD) can only be made when the river level at the intake structure is above 91.2 feet mean sea level (MSL). When the river level falls below 91.2 feet MSL the diversion rate shall not exceed 20 MGD., provided that a minimum flow of 4,460 Cubic feet per second (CFS) will be maintained immediately below the intake during the months of May and June and a minimum flow of 1,715 CFS will be maintained at all other times. If the river flows fall below the minimums noted above then the diversions noted in special condition No. 1 of the original permit shall apply. A report to demonstrate compliance with this condition will be sent to us annually during the month of September. Except where stated otherwise, reports, drawings, correspondence and any other submittals required by this permit shall be marked with the words Permit No. NAE2004896 and shall be addressed to: Inspection Section, CENAE-R, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, 696 Virginia Road, Concord, MA 01742-2751

This amendment is only valid until December 31, 2009, after which, you must reapply to us so that we may reevaluate river withdrawals and impacts to fisheries:

The conditions of the original permit remain in full force and effect.
