## Re: Investigation into Implementation of Standards in the Energy Policy Act of 2005

Dear Secretary Howland:

In compliance with New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") Order No. 24,893, dated September 15, 2008, in the abovereferenced docket, enclosed on behalf of Unitil Energy Systems, Inc. ("UES"), are an original and seven copies of the following tariff pages:

In the Order, the affected utilities were ordered to complete work on a common draft tariff for interconnection of generating sources of up to 10 kVA and possible inverter based sources up to 100 kVA as described in the Report of the Technical Session of April 25, 2008 filed on May 13, 2008, and to file utility specific tariffs based on such common draft by December 31, 2008.

Please disregard the previous letter submission from UES on this matter, dated December 30, 2008, and replace it with the instant filing.

To comply with the Commission's Order, a section entitled "Interconnection Standards for Generating Facilities" has been added to the Terms and Conditions for Delivery Service section of UES' Tariff. This new section references the Company's "Interconnection Standards for Inverters Sized Up to 100KVA" manual ("Manual"). UES proposes that the Manual, which provides standardized rules for interconnection of inverter based generators with UES' distribution facilities, be incorporated in UES' Tariff by reference.

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The Manual will be available to customers at the Company's website at <u>www.unitil.com</u> or upon request. This approach will simplify the process for keeping customers and other interested persons abreast of the most current approved version of the Interconnection Standards, should updates or refinements be required. A copy of the Manual is attached.

The Interconnection Standards have been reviewed and approved by UES, Granite State Electric Company, Public Service Company of New Hampshire and the Commission's Staff. Any future changes to the Standards will be first reviewed and approved by these parties and Staff and then filed with the Commission for approval.
