ORDER OF NOTICE

The Energy Policy Act of 2005 (EPAAct) was signed into law on August 8, 2005. Sections 1251, 1252 and 1254 of the EPAAct require state commissions to consider five new federal standards that have been added to Title I of the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act and make specific determinations as to whether implementation of the standards is appropriate.

The first three standards, which concern Net Metering, Fuel Sources and Fossil Fuel Generation Efficiency, are set forth in Section 1251 of EPAAct. For these standards, state commissions have up to two years after enactment, or until August 8, 2007, to commence consideration of the standards. The EPAAct provides that state commissions have up to three years, or until August 8, 2008, to complete consideration and determine whether to adopt the additional standards.

The fourth standard for consideration, under Section 1252 of EPAAct, concerns Time-Based Metering and Communications or "Smart Metering". The EPAAct requires that each state regulatory authority conduct an investigation and determine whether it is appropriate for electric utilities "to provide and install time-based meters and communications devices for each of their customers which enable such customers to participate in time-based pricing rate schedules and other demand response programs." The EPAAct requires state commissions to commence investigation of Smart Metering no later than August 8, 2006, and make a final determination no later than August 8, 2007. Section 1252 contemplates the possibility that no consideration is necessary if certain "prior state action" criteria occurred within the last three years.

The fifth standard for consideration, under Section 1254 of EPAAct, concerns Interconnection. Under this standard, interconnection service means interconnection to the local distribution company of an electric customer who has on-site generation in accordance with the interconnection standards developed by the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers: IEEE Standard 1547 for Interconnecting Distributed Resources with Electric Power Systems. State commissions are required to commence consideration of this standard by August 8, 2006, and determine whether to adopt the standard by August 8, 2007.

FURTHER ORDERED, that, immediately following the Prehearing Conference, interested parties and the Staff of the Commission hold a Technical Session to discuss the investigation and establish a proposed procedural schedule; and it is

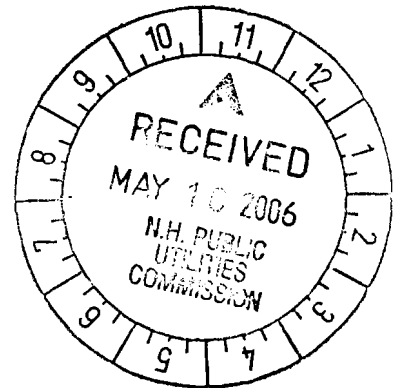
