

- 1. Hunt Technologies, Inc. ("Hunt") is a party interested in the above-captioned docket as it is a meter technology provider which has participated extensively in rulemaking proceedings in other states involving the implementation of the Energy Policy Act of 2005, specifically addressing the Smart Metering and Demand Response provisions beginning at Section 1252 of the Electricity Title of the Act.
