## DW 06-166 LAKES REGION WATER COMPANY, INC. Petition for Tariff Modifications Regarding Service Fees Order Nisi Approving Modified Service Fees ORDER NO. 24,730 February 16, 2007

Lakes Region Water Company, Inc., (Lakes Region), which provides water service in parts of Campton, Thornton, Conway, Laconia, Gilford, Ossipee, Freedom, Tamworth, Wolfeboro, Tuftonboro, and Moultonboro, filed a request with the New

Tamworth, Wolfeboro, Tuttonboro, and Moultonboro, filed a request with the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission (Commission) on December 8, 2006 to increase certain service fees. Lakes Region amended its filing on January 24, 2007. At issue is Lakes Region's new customer service fee as well as service charges for shutoffs, connetions, disconnections and reconnections. Currently, Lakes Region charges a new customer service fee of \$18.00, which the Company seeks to increase to \$25.00. Lakes Region currently imposes service charges for shutoffs, connections, and disconnections that range from \$40.00 to \$60.00 depending on how far away the water system is located from Lakes Region's main office. On February 7, 2007, Commission Staff (Staff) filed a letter recommending approval of the proposed fees. Staff concluded that Lakes Region's request is reasonable because the proposed charges would more accurately reflect the cost of providing the services involved. Staff also noted that the current fees have been in effect for

the services involved. Staff also noted that the current fees have been in effect for over ten years without adjustment to reflect increased costs. According to Lakes Region, its office staff labor rate is now approximately \$14.00 per hour, which is significantly more than it was at the time the current customer service fee was estab-

With respect to the service charge applicble to shutoffs, connections, and reconnections, Staff prepared the following chart to summarize the present and proposed charges by system:

As with the new customer service fee, Lakes Region states the service charges have also not been adjusted in years increases in costs. Several of the systems - Indian Mound, Deer Cove, Lake Ossipee Village, and Gunstock Glen - are recent acquisitions, with service fees that were set under a prior owner. In Order No. 24,692 (October 31, 2006), we approved a general rate increase for Lakes Region without revising the fees at issue here. According to Staff, Lakes Region's annual income from the currently effective fees approximately \$40,000, or about 5.5 percent, of the Company's total operating revenues. Staff estimated that the proposed fee increases would generate approximately \$10,000 in additional revenue. According to Staff, this increase would not cause Lakes Region to earn a return on investment in excess of that already authorized because planned capital improvement projects, such as installing meters and constructing a water storage facility, would likely absorb the additional revenue. See Lakes Region Water Company, Inc., 88 NH PUC 663 (2003) (approving projects) and Order No. 24,693, slip op. at 9 (describing currently financial effects of these projects and approving step adjustment to general rates). Based on our review of the filling and Staff's analysis, and pending any requests for further proceedings, we find that the proposed fees are lawful, just and reasonable. Although Lakes Region requested an effective date of December 1, 2006, RSA 378:3 requires at least 30 days' notice to the Commission to a change in any rates. We thus adopt an appropriate effective date on a nisi basis to allow an opportunity for public comappropriate effective date on a nisi basis to allow an opportunity for public com-

gion Water Company, Inc., is authorized to revise its new customer service fee and service charges as identified above; and it is **FURTHER ORDERED**, that Lakes Region Water Company, shall cause a copy of this Order Nisi to be published once in a state-wide newspaper of general circulation or of circulation in those portions of the state where operations are conducted, with a copy mailed to the Town Clerk in each town served, such publication to be no later than February 26, 2007 and to be documented by affidavit filed with this office on or before March 16, 2007; and it is **FURTHER ORDERED**, that all persons interested in responding to this Order *Nisi* be notified that they may submit their comments or file a written request for a hearing which states the reason and basis for a hearing no later than Marth 5, 2007 for the Commission's consideration; and it is **FURTHER ORDERED**, that any party interested in responding to such comments or request for hearing shall do so no later than March 12, 2007; and it is **FURTHER ORDERED**, that this Order *Nisi* shall be effective March 16, 2007, unless Lakes Region Water Company, Inc. fails to satisfy the publication obligation set forth above or the Commission provides otherwise in a supplemental order issued prior to the effective date; and it is **FURTHER ORDERED**, that Lakes Region Water Company, Inc. file a compliance tariff on or before March 16, 2007 in accordance with N.H. Admin. Rule Puc 1605.02. By order of the Public Utilities Commission of New Hampshire this sixteenth day of February 2007.
