ITEM: NECTA/CPNH R-14 How many years' worth of pole and conduit attachment license records (e.g., license agreements, records of numbers and locations of attachments, billing and payment records) will be provided by Verizon to FairPoint and how will the complete and accurate transmission of this information to FairPoint be verified? Will Verizon retain copies of these records; if so, for how long?

REPLY: Verizon will provide all pole attachment and conduit occupancy license records to FairPoint. The licenses are paper records, filed by municipality and customer name. They are not filed by year and, therefore, the number of years' worth of licenses is not maintained in the normal course of business and thus is not available.

All license records and original license agreements will be sent to FairPoint via overnight courier whereby the shipments are tracked. Each shipment will contain a list of its contents. The pole attachment and conduit occupancy agreements are identified in a database and will be itemized by a control number.

Original versions of the pole attachment and conduit occupancy agreements will be provided to FairPoint as part of the documents that FairPoint will receive after Closing. Verizon will keep a hard copy of the pole attachment and conduit occupancy agreements as part of the data room assembled for due diligence. These copies will remain in Verizon's possession permanently as part of the transaction records.

To facilitate license billing, Verizon will be providing extracts of all data pertinent to New Hampshire. This data will be extracted from the Pole Record System by identifying the state code for each record along

with the specific wire center. The data extract will include a copy of every record in the Verizon database. The required data extract process was developed with support from Verizon business subject matter experts to ensure all necessary data is provided. The first test data extract from full production data was completed on August 31, 2007. The second test data extract from full production data is scheduled for January 31, 2008. The final extract is scheduled for the weekend of full exit from Verizon.

Verizon will maintain an archive of former license records for the normal archive interval as specified by business requirements.
