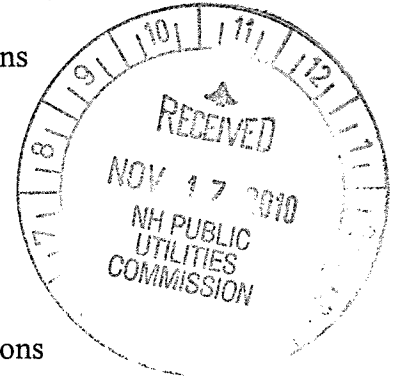

Forfeiture of CLEC Authorization

Pursuant to NH Admin. Rule Puc 431.13 (a), Global NAPs, Inc. ("GNAPs") has forfeit its CLEC authorization. Puc 431.13 (a), states:

"A CLEC failing to file an annual report for 2 successive years shall, after notice and opportunity for a hearing, forfeit its authority to operate."

GNAPs did not file annual reports for calendar years 2008 and 2009. The 2009 report was due March 31, 2010.

In an administrative letter, dated September 20, 2010, the Commission notified GNAPs that it would revoke GNAPs' authority to operate in New Hampshire within 30 days of the date of the letter, unless a request for an adjudicative hearing was formally filed with the Commission pursuant to Puc 203.02. Four copies of the letter were concurrently sent, via certified mail with return receipt requested, to the GNAPs addresses listed in the table below. The Commission received notifications that two of the letters were signed for and received at two of the addresses; the first at the location under Address 2 on September 23, 2010, and the second at the location under Address 4 on October 2, 2010. The table on the following page summarizes this.

As of this date, which is well beyond the 30 day requirement stated in the Commission letter, GNAPs has provided no response nor has it formally filed a request for an adjudicative hearing with the Commission pursuant to Puc 203.02. Accordingly, GNAPs has forfeit its certification and is no longer authorized to operate as a public utility in New Hampshire.
