1 PROCEEDING

CMSR. HARRINGTON: Okay. Good morning. Glad we got a big enough room to handle the crowd. Today we are here to consider Steam rules 1000. We are considering approval of the final proposal for readoption without amendment of the Steam rules located in Puc Rules Chapter 1100, and considered in Docket DRM 190 [12-190?]. The Initial Proposal for these rules was approved by the Committee on July 11th, 2012, and then submitted to JLCAR for its review.

Public notice was provided by publication in the Rulemaking Register on October 4th, 2012. And, the single affected steam utility in the state, Concord Steam, has been aware of the proposed readoption without amendment since July, giving their assent to this proposal to leave the rules unchanged.

We have not received any public comments as of yet. And, I see that Concord Steam is in the room today.

Commissioner Scott, do you have any comments?

CMSR. SCOTT: I just want to, kind of a generic problem, and I just want to make sure, even without comments from the public that, you know, it's

incumbent upon the Staff of the Commission here to make sure we're describing as much as possible rules for -- to make sure they're as streamlined as possible and the bang for the buck is there. So, I just want to make sure that we're continuing to do that.

And, certainly, for any regulated entities are impacted by our rules, we absolutely rely on you to tell us where things can be made better. So, appreciate any comments that you may have.

CMSR. HARRINGTON: And, I just might follow up on that by saying that one of the things we're looking for is value-added or, in some cases, I guess it could be nonvalue-added. So, if there's something here that we're doing simply because we did it last year, and we did it last year because we did it five years ago, those are things we would like to hear about. So, if there's something that is being done for compliance only, without adding value, which I guess, as Commissioner Scott said, has to really rely on the utility to tell us that, because sometimes we're not in a position to actually determine that ourselves.

So, do have any comments you would like to make in that regard?
