## **ORDER OF NOTICE**

On December 17, 2012, Concord Steam Corporation (Concord Steam), pursuant to the terms of Commission Order No. 24,969 (May 22, 2009), issued in Docket No. DG 08-107, filed for: (i) a determination by the Commission that Concord Steam's updated plan to enter into a certain Steam Purchase Agreement with Concord Power and Steam, LLC (Concord Power), under which Concord Power will supply all of Concord Steam's steam requirements for retail steam service for a minimum period of 30 years, would be prudent and in the public interest; (ii) a determination by the Commission that the updated plan for the construction of system upgrades by Concord Steam necessary to interconnect its distribution system to the proposed new Concord Power cogeneration facility would be prudent and in the public interest; and (iii) Commission approval pursuant to RSA 374:30 for Concord Steam to sell certain utility assets to Concord Power for \$500,000. The petition and subsequent docket filings, other than any information for which confidential treatment is requested of or granted by the Commission, will be posted to the Commission's website at http://www.puc.nh.gov/Regulatory/Docketbk/ 2012/12-371.html.

The filing raises, inter alia, issues related to the reasonableness and prudence of Concord Steam's business plan going forward; the ongoing progress of Concord Power's financing and construction plans for the new cogeneration facility, which have not been finalized; and whether it is prudent and in the public interest for Concord Steam to : (i) sell certain utility assets to Concord Power and, if so, at what price; (ii) implement the revised plan for upgrading the current steam distribution system and interconnect with the Concord Power planned cogeneration facility; and (iii) enter into the long term Steam Purchase Agreement with Concord Power under the terms and conditions specified in the Agreement, as revised by Concord Steam since the issuance of Order No. 24,969. Each party has the right to have an attorney represent the party at the party's own expense. Based upon the foregoing, it is hereby

ORDERED, that a Prehearing Conference, pursuant to N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.15, be held before the Commission located at 21 S. Fruit St., Suite 10, Concord, New Hampshire on February 22, 2013 at 10:00 a.m., at which each party will provide a preliminary statement of its position with regard to the petition and any of the issues set forth in N.H. FURTHER ORDERED, that, immediately following the Prehearing Conference, Concord Steam, the Staff of the Commission and any Intervenors hold a Technical Session to review the petition and allow Concord Steam to provide any amendments or updates to its filing; and it is
