


Our building was renovated to serve as the town hall. The Food Pantry remained and the Clothes Closet was set up in the rear section of what was Madrick's Hardware Store. Donations increased in both number and kind. So did the volunteers. In time, items were segregated and sold at minimal cost to cover rent and utilities. A few years ago a major remodeling project provided improved space and a more attractive distribution of items resulting in the nonprofit "shop" it is today.
