2014 Summer Period Cost of Gas Adjustment

ORDER OF NOTICE

On March 17, 2014, Liberty Utilities (EnergyNorth Natural Gas) Corp., d/b/a Liberty Utilities (Liberty), filed with the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) its proposed cost of gas (COG) rates for the summer period, May 1, 2014 through October 31, 2014. Included in the filing were revised tariff pages and supporting materials for the changed rates. The petition and subsequent docket filings, other than any information for which confidential treatment is requested of or granted by the Commission, will be posted to the Commission's website at <http://www.puc.nh.gov/Regulatory/Docketbk/2014/14-076.html>.

The proposed residential COG rate is \$0.5436 per therm, a \$0.1369 per therm decrease from the weighted average residential COG rate of \$0.6805 per therm for last summer. The proposed change to Liberty's residential COG rate, combined with previously approved changes in distribution rates and the Local Distribution Adjustment Charge, is expected to decrease a typical residential heating customer's summer bill by approximately \$19, or 7.9 percent, compared to last summer.

The proposed commercial/industrial low winter use COG rate is \$0.5377 per therm and the proposed commercial/industrial high winter use COG rate is \$0.5456 per therm. The changes in commercial/industrial low and high winter use rates are commensurate with the changes in the COG rate of a residential heating customer.

The filing raises, *inter alia*, issues related to: RSA 378 and the justness and reasonableness of rates, fares, and charges; the reasonableness of sales forecasts, supplier prices, and transportation prices; reconciliation of prior period costs and revenues; the causes and treatment of a prior period over-recovery; purchasing decisions related to the current and past summer supplies and capacity; revenue projections related to transportation services and released capacity; and revenues and rate impacts resulting from the proposed rate changes. Each party has the right to have an attorney represent the party at the party's own expense.

Based upon the foregoing, it is hereby

ORDERED, that a hearing be held before the Commission located at 21 S. Fruit St., Suite 10, Concord, New Hampshire on April 16, 2014 at 9:00 a.m.; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that Liberty Utilities, the Staff of the Commission and any Intervenors hold a Technical Session on April 10, 2014 at 9:00 a.m. to review the petition and allow Liberty Utilities to provide any amendments or updates to its filing; and it is


FURTHER ORDERED, that pursuant to N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.12, Liberty Utilities shall notify all persons desiring to be heard at this hearing by publishing a copy of this Order of Notice no later than March 27, 2014, in a newspaper with general circulation in those portions of the state in which operations are conducted, publication to be documented by affidavit filed with the Commission on or before April 11, 2014; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that pursuant to N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.02, any party seeking to intervene in the proceeding shall submit to the Commission seven copies of a Petition to Intervene with copies sent to Liberty Utilities and the Office of the Consumer Advocate on or before April 11, 2014, such Petition stating the facts demonstrating how its rights, duties, privileges, immunities or other substantial interest may be affected by the

proceeding, as required by N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.17 and RSA 541-A:32, I(b); and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that any party objecting to a Petition to Intervene make said Objection on or before April 16, 2014.
