Dear Mr. McNeil:

On September 8, 2014, the Commission received applications filed by the New Hampshire Electric Cooperative (NHEC) requesting Class II eligibility for NHEC member photovoltaic (PV) arrays¹ and inclusion in the NHEC aggregation². The applicants include: Bruce D. Ahern (Ahern); Lance T. Burak (Burak); David Dunkel – Shepherds View Ranch, LLC (Dunkel); Dan Poor (Poor); Craig T. Snow (Snow); Victoria Stigum (Stigum); Stephen Wyle (Wyle); and the Mt. Washington Observatory.

¹ Pursuant to RSA 362-F, New Hampshire's Electric Renewable Portfolio Standard law Class II eligibility requires a facility to produce electricity from solar technologies that began operation after January 1, 2006 (RSA 362-F:4, II).

² The Commission granted NHEC Independent Monitor status on May 12, 2009 (DE 09-006). On April 9, 2010, the Commission granted NHEC the authority to aggregate customer-sited sources pursuant to Puc 2506 (DE 10-060).

Staff has reviewed these applications and has recommended approval of these PV arrays as eligible for Class II RECs and inclusion in the NHEC aggregation as listed in the following table:

Because these facilities are customer-sited sources, the output is not recorded in the New England Power Pool Market Settlement System and, as a result, the output must be monitored and verified by an independent monitor. The applications state that NHEC will monitor the facilities' output as required by N.H. Code of Administrative Rules Puc 2505.08 and 2505.09. The total output from these facilities will be included as part of the NHEC Class II Aggregation's total output reported to the NEPOOL Generation Information System as approved by the Commission on April 9, 2010.

The Commission has determined that NHEC has provided all the information necessary to demonstrate these facilities' eligibility for certification and hereby certifies the above named PV arrays as eligible for Class II RECs and inclusion in the NHEC aggregation effective as of the dates listed in the table above.
