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PROCEEDINGS

MR. CHAIRMAN: Good morning. We're here this morning in Docket DW 16-619, which is Lakes Region Water Company's Petition to Transfer Utility Assets of Dockham Shores Estates Water Company. And there's a number of related approvals within that request. It's a prehearing conference this morning to take the preliminary positions of the parties and deal with any other matters we need to deal with before you have a technical session.

Before we go any further, let's take appearances.

MR. RICHARDSON: Thank you. Good morning, Chairman and Commissioners. Justin Richardson with Upton & Hatfield here on behalf of Lakes Region Water Company. With me here at counsel table I have Leah Valladares to my right, who is the Utilities Manager, and Tom Mason, who is President of Lakes Region Water Company.

MR. WOOD: Thank you, Commissioners. Ethan Wood, with the Patrick Wood Law Office.

And with me is Colin Robertson, who is the President of the Dockham Shores Estates Water Company.

MR. CICALE: Good morning,

Commissioners. Nick Cicale, for the Office of

Consumer Advocate, on behalf of residential

ratepayers. Along with me is Dr. Pradip

Chattopadhyay, Assistant Consumer Advocate.

MR. CLIFFORD: John Clifford, on behalf of Commission Staff. With me at counsel table is Mark Naylor, Director of the Gas and Water Division, and Jayson Laflamme, Staff Analyst.

MR. CHAIRMAN: I don't have any interventions in the file. Are there any intervenors that any of the parties knows about?

MR. RICHARDSON: I believe Staff received an e-mail from the homeowner's association, which Staff shared with us. But I don't see anyone here, and we know that the Affidavits of Publication were all properly noticed and are on file with the Commission.

1	So I have not been contacted and I've not seen
2	an intervention request.
3	MR. CHAIRMAN: The short version of
4	that is, "I'm not aware of any"; right?
5	MR. RICHARDSON: Correct.
6	MR. CLIFFORD: Staff's not aware of
7	any. We checked the docket this morning.
8	MR. CHAIRMAN: Are there any
9	preliminary matters we need to deal with before
10	we hear your preliminary positions?
11	MR. CLIFFORD: None that I'm aware
12	of.
13	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: All right.
14	Hearing none, Mr. Richardson, why don't you
15	proceed.
16	MR. RICHARDSON: Thank you, Mr.
17	Chairman.
18	Lakes Region thinks this is a
19	very good proposal. I won't go through it in
20	all of its details. But we have here a system
21	that needs upgrades. We have a system that
22	needs an operator. This system is located in
23	the areas that are served by Lakes Region. For

its part, Lakes Region wants to balance its capital structure. That's been recommended by Staff and other parties in its rate case. And so we've proposed debt financing to move us towards our goal of a 50/50 balance of debt and equity. So we think this is a project that will help and benefit the customers of Dockham Shores and Lakes Region. We've gone through all the details in our petition, and we look forward to working with all the parties in trying to reach a favorable outcome for everyone.

MR. CHAIRMAN: Mr. Wood.

MR. WOOD: We actually agree wholeheartedly with what Mr. Richardson has said regarding the need to transfer the water company to Lakes Region, and we're looking forward to that.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Mr. Cicale.

MR. CICALE: The Office of Consumer

Advocate is cautiously supportive of the

companies' joint filing here for change of

control of Dockham Shores to Lakes Region. The

capital structure of Lakes Region is rather high on the equity side, so this infused debt would help ease the pain for the ratepayers of Lakes Region as that rate case continues forward to an outcome. And the customers of Dockham Shores would definitely benefit by a new operator in the form of Lakes Region for their system.

MR. CHAIRMAN: Mr. Clifford.

MR. CLIFFORD: Commission Staff is generally supportive of the idea of smaller water companies being acquired by operators with the proper financial, managerial and technical skills to run a water system.

Dockham is a small water system, has an aging plant and equipment. There's notation in the file about atmospheric storage tank issues, noted by the Department of Environmental Services in their recent survey. So, while we're generally supportive, we have some concerns, and we will make a -- pay close attention to the issues surrounding the transfer. And I'll make a formal

recommendation at some point during this 1 2 proceeding. 3 MR. CHAIRMAN: Commissioner Bailey 4 has a question. 5 QUESTIONS BY CMSR. BAILEY: CMSR. BAILEY: I was going to ask a 6 question about the DES finding in December. 7 Mr. Robertson, you received a 8 letter from DES advising you of a significant 9 deficiency in the filler pipe. And it was my 10 understanding that it was supposed to be 11 corrected in 30 days. Has that been -- has 12 that work been completed? 13 MR. ROBERTSON: Yes. I have a 14 memorandum here from Cindy Klevens from the 15 Department of Environmental Services. She's 16 closed the deficiency based on the repair work 17 18 that was done by Lakes Region Water recently, and that issue has been resolved. 19 CMSR. BAILEY: Okay. Thank you. 20 21 Good news. MR. CHAIRMAN: I think Commissioner 22 Scott may have a question as well. 23

QUESTIONS BY CMSR. SCOTT:

CMSR. SCOTT: On Page 3 of Exhibit A, you mentioned "construction work in progress."

I was curious what is -- is there construction work in progress, or was that just a space filler in case there was? I can direct you more closely to that if you want.

MR. ROBERTSON: I don't have any construction work in progress. I'm not sure what that refers to.

MR. WOOD: I think that was a space filler, Commissioner.

CMSR. SCOTT: Is that correct, Mr. Richardson?

MR. RICHARDSON: That is correct. In the event there were to be a project that was in process during closing, then that provision would control how it was handled and how the costs were addressed.

CMSR. SCOTT: Okay. Thank you. And I think that's my -- the only other question I was going to ask was about the DES order. But I'm happy that's resolved. So, good.

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CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: All right.
