and Natural Gas Aggregator Licenses

Dear Secretary Howland:

IDT Energy Network, LLC f/k/a Epiq Energy, LLC ("IDTEN"), a licensed electricity aggregator (last renewed on December 27, 2016 in Docket No. DM 16-870) and a licensed natural gas aggregator (last renewed on January 26, 2017 in Docket No. DM 16-871) in the State of New Hampshire, respectfully requests the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") accept this letter as sufficient to meet the 30-day notification requirements at Puc 2004.07 and Puc 3004.06.

IDTEN hereby notifies the Commission that it has ceased doing business under those licenses in New Hampshire. IDTEN did not take title to the electricity or natural gas that it marketed and it has no outstanding complaints or other obligations in New Hampshire. Additionally, IDTEN has no customers under contract. As such, IDTEN respectfully requests that the Commission waive the 30-day notification requirement, authorize IDTEN's relinquishment of its above-referenced licenses, relieve IDTEN of any future compliance obligations to the Commission.
