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PROCEEDING

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: We're here this morning in Docket 17-151, which is Eversource's Stranded Cost Recovery Charge docket. We have a prehearing conference scheduled for this morning.

I don't think there's anything else we need to do before we take appearances.

MR. FOSSUM: Good morning,

Commissioners. Matthew Fossum, here for Public

Service Company of New Hampshire doing business
as Eversource Energy.

MR. BUCKLEY: Good morning, Mr.

Chairman, Commissioners Bailey and Giaimo. My
name is Brian D. Buckley. I'm a staff attorney
with the Office of the Consumer Advocate. To
my left is Mr. James Brennan, Director of
Finance of the Office of the Consumer Advocate.
And we're here today representing the interests
of residential ratepayers.

MS. AMIDON: Good morning. Suzanne
Amidon, for Commission Staff. And with me is
Rich Chagnon, who is an Analyst in the Electric
Division.

1 CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: All right. Ιs there anything in the way of preliminary 2 matters we need to deal with before we hear the 3 4 parties' positions? 5 MR. FOSSUM: None that I'm aware of. 6 CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Mr. Fossum, why 7 don't you start us off. 8 MR. FOSSUM: Thank you. I have a 9 very extensive multipage statement I'd like to 10 read into the record -- actually, I'm kidding 11 entirely. 12 This, when the Commission issued 13 Order -- oh, drat, I knew I would forget the 14 number -- in Docket 17-113, the Commission had 15 issued an order recently, whose number escapes 16 me at the moment, and I apologize for that, 17 requiring the Company to make its customary 18 Energy Service and Stranded Cost filing for 19 effect January 1st of 2018. And, so, on 20 October 2nd, that is what we have done. 21 It's the Company's position that we 22 have calculated and provided a Stranded Cost 23 Recovery Charge rate consistent with what we 24 have done in the past, and that it is a just

and reasonable rate and should be approved.

that there are a number of other moving parts that may affect this rate. Divestiture is impending. And it's not quite clear what may come out of the divestiture docket specifically, or out of docket 17-113, relative to PSNH's transition to competitively procured default service. And, so, we are aware of that, we are mindful of that. But, unless and until we hear something definitive otherwise, we would ask that the rate we have filed in this case be reviewed and approved, and be allowed to go into effect on January 1st.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Mr. Buckley.

MR. BUCKLEY: The OCA is still evaluating the issues presented in the instant Petition, particularly in light of the upcoming divestiture. That said, we are optimistic about the ability of the parties to reach an expedient and amicable resolution of those issues.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Ms. Amidon.

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1 MS. AMIDON: Thank you. The order 2 that Mr. Fossum was referring to was Order 3 Number 26,056 that the Commission issued on 4 September 21st, in Docket 17-113. And, in 5 fact, he includes that in his cover letter to 6 his Petition, just to point that out to you. 7 Staff will review the proposed SCRC in its customary manner. We also understand 8 9 and that we are in discussions with the Company 10 and with the OCA on whether -- on the approach 11 to take for procurement of energy service 12 following divestiture and the timing of that. 13 We trust that the Company will come up with a 14 proposal shortly that will allow us to consider

those issues.

But, in the meantime, we intend to conduct an investigation in this docket as we normally do, in order to assure that there is a Stranded Cost rate in effect for January 1.
