In compliance with the Commission's Order No. 26,116 in Docket No. DE 18-023 (Petition for Adjustment to Stranded Cost Recovery Charge, Order Approving Stranded Cost Recovery Charge), the following tariff pages are transmitted herewith:

Effective: April 1, 2018

In Order No. 26,116, the Commission approved an increase in the overall retail average stranded cost recovery rate from 0.042 to 1.513 cents per kilowatt-hour. This increase is largely due to payment on bonds that will be issued to cover costs remaining after the recent sales of the company's regulated power plants.

The Commission also approved a decrease in the company's Default Energy Service Rate DE effective April 1, 2018 in its Order No. 26,104. Revised tariff pages were filed with the Commission in compliance with this Order on February 28, 2018.

For customers receiving energy service under Rate DE, the combined impact of the two rate changes is a 9.3% decrease on Eversource's overall average retail rate.

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Black-lined tariff pages denoting the stranded cost recovery charge changes effective April 1, 2018 have been submitted for easy identification of the changes.

Supplemental Information on the Filing

The enclosed "Summary of Rates" reports effective April 1, 2018, May 1, 2018, June 1, 2018 and July 1, 2018 show, by rate class and rate component, all rates and charges in the Company's tariff. In addition, we have enclosed a schedule of "Typical Bill Comparisons" based on the previous rates and the new rates. The Residential Delivery Service Rate R monthly bill for 600 kilowatt-hours (with no water heating, and including default energy service), previously \$123.64, will decrease to \$114.52 on April 1, 2018, a decrease of \$9.12 or -7.4%
