CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Good morning, everyone. We're here in Docket DW 18-099, which is a petition from the Town of Derry for approval of a franchise expansion into a portion of the town of Londonderry. We're scheduled for a prehearing conference, to be followed by a technical session of the parties. Before we do anything else, let's take appearances.

MS. BROWN: Sorry for the delay. I thought I was on the other side of the room. Marcia Brown, with N.H. Brown Law, representing the Town of Derry. And to my immediate right is Tom Carrier, who is the deputy director of public works for Derry and oversees the provision of or the operations of the sewer system and water system in Derry. And to his right is Jayson Lopez, who is the project manager with Keach-Nordstrom, obviously associated with the project. to his right is Paul Kerrigan, who is the chief operating officer of Chinburg Properties and is affiliated with the Lorden

Commons development and also the Lorden

Commons Sewer, which is a regulated public

utility. Thank you.

MS. FABRIZIO: Good morning, Mr. Chairman and Commissioners. Lynn Fabrizio, on behalf of Staff. Today with me at the table are Jayson Laflamme, assistant director of the Gas and Water Division, and Anthony Leone, utility analyst with the Gas and Water Division.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Is there anything we need to do or know before we hear the preliminary positions of the parties?

[No verbal response]

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: I didn't think so. Ms. Brown, why don't you start us off.

PRELIMINARY STATEMENTS

MS. BROWN: Good morning. Thank
you for your time. As stated in the
petition, Derry seeks approval of a franchise
footprint outside of its corporate bounds in
a small section of Londonderry. Derry also
seeks approval to charge a Merrimack source
discharge -- I'm sorry -- Merrimack source

development charge that is 15 percent higher than its existing MSDC charge, and also requests the Commission allow Derry to remain exempt for general rate regulation.

In support of its managerial, technical and financial expertise, Derry has, in the petition, identified where the Commission has previously found it to possess the requisite managerial, technical and financial expertise, and that was in 1982 when it first expanded into the town of Londonderry. And that expansion was to address local contamination. And then in 1996, Derry took over the Beacon Hill and Scobie Pond franchise areas during the break-up of the Consumers New Hampshire Water Company in Derry. And in this particular situation, Derry is amenable to providing the Lorden Commons development with water and seeks franchise approval.

Now, as I said earlier with the appearances, the Commission is familiar with this development, in that the Lorden Commons Sewer Company was formed to serve this

development. The franchise boundary which is denoted in green in one of the exhibits to the testimony is the exact footprint of the water supply to the development. But then you will also see in that chart a map, a red area of the map, and that is an area that makes sense, between the town of Londonderry and Derry, for Derry to also serve in the event there is a need to supply homes along that stretch, again, with an eye towards a potential creep of the Auburn Road Super Fund Site contaminant plume.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Ms. Brown, before you continue, I have that map in front of me. From which direction would that plume be coming if I'm looking at that map?

MS. BROWN: On the exhibit you will see a descriptive paragraph. That is in the vicinity of the landfill.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Okay. Thank you.

MS. BROWN: This project is not insignificant. It is a project to construct 83 additional homes, but in phases in this

area.

In support of its managerial, technical and financial expertise, the Town also obtained its suitability and availability letter from the Department of Environmental Services. So that is already in the record, or in the filing.

With respect to agreements, it may get a little bit complicated, but there are multiple water supply agreements providing service to this area, one being that the town of Derry gets some water from Manchester Water Works, and that's under a 2013 agreement. But there is a caveat in that agreement, as explained in the petition, that Derry cannot serve outside of its corporate limits unless it has Manchester Water Works approval. In seeking that approval, it necessitated an additional water supply agreement, where Manchester Water Works has agreed to provide the volumes necessary to serve this development, but seeks to charge the present MSDC charge. And so Derry seeks, in approving this MSDC charge -- essentially,

it's going to be a pass-through of the Manchester rate to the customers in this proposed Londonderry area.

There is also an agreement between Lorden Commons and Derry as to what assets are going to be constructed and how those assets will be conveyed, including easements that will be conveyed to Derry once they are constructed. We wanted to update the Commission because the filing was made back in June. There have been some additional approvals that have occurred. To supplement, the Town of Derry Planning Board has approved the contract -- the construction of the project, but with conditions, and one of the conditions precedent is PUC approval of the public water source; so, in effect, Lorden Commons cannot proceed with any construction of its assets for the water system until it gets PUC approval. It has the wetlands approval from DES. It has also obtained approval from the Army Corps for this project, and it also has its alteration of terrain permit. So I'm not trying to --

knowing that the Commission has a lot of work ahead of it, it would be appreciated by the developer if we could get a relatively quick turnaround and approval of this franchise request.

So, with that, Staff -- or the Town of Derry looks forward --

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: You went to the other side of the room again, didn't you.

MS. BROWN: -- looks forward to working with Staff and any other parties in a technical session after this and is available to answer any questions you have. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Ms. Fabrizio.

MS. FABRIZIO: Thank you, Mr.

Chairman. Staff has reviewed the filing, and at this point we've identified the major issue in the case to be the Town's request to remain exempt from Commission regulation under RSA 362:4, III-a, given the Merrimack source development charge that you've heard about. And the Town proposes to pass this charge through to each of its Londonderry customers. And per the statute, we need to

examine the magnitude of that charge and the difference in the rates charged to the Derry customers versus the new Londonderry customers. In that respect, we do have a few questions to clarify certain facts within the petition, which we will go over with the Company during our technical session this morning, and we do intend to engage in some discovery on this matter. And we will also work with the Company today to develop a procedural schedule, which we will submit shortly to the Commission for its review. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: All right. If there's nothing else, we will leave you to your technical session and thank you for what you've done this morning.
