On December 19, 2012, the Program extension was approved. Participants that were formerly hesitant to participate are now eager to submit their applications. We anticipate that there will be several new applications to the P4P Program during the next quarter as a result of this extension.

With 53 applications submitted and 33 projects underway, the Program is doing very well. We would have liked to have more projects under construction by now but recognize that large, comprehensive projects move slower than simple equipment change-outs. Partners have been soliciting input on additional projects beyond the 53 represented by submitted applications and interest in the Program and related activity has increased substantially during this quarter.

5) Summarize work to be completed next quarter.

Several new projects entered the Program during this quarter. We anticipate the Program being fully subscribed by the end of the second quarter if this level of submittals is sustained. We will keep Partners up to date on available funding levels. With 39 active projects in the Program pipeline, the second quarter of 2013 will likely see increased activity in both ERP submittals and site inspections.

Using an evaluation panel including representatives from NH PUC, and TRC, one (1) Partner Application is tentatively scheduled to be reviewed through a formal quarterly RFQ and review process.
