Comments of Frederick King - Coos County Treasurer Friday, October 15, 2010

Dear Laura:

Let me begin by saying that the report was well done and met the terms of the agreement. I do have some thoughts that I would like to have considered.

- 1. On page 3-18 there is reference by stakeholders that no master planning is in place for zoning communities in the North Country. This is not true and I think that the report should indicate that in fact for the Coos County's Unincorporated Places where new generation projects are planned that since 1988 a County Planning Board has had a Master Plan with appropriate zoning and sub-division and other land use documents in place.
- 2. I do not believe that the State Legislature would ever agree to provide state funding in any form for any transmission line project.
- 3. On October 4th the day the Commission last met Northeast Utilities filed their Form 8-K with the US SEC in support of the 1,200 MW transmission line project developed with NStar. In effect it appears that through a new venture entitled Northern Pass Transmission LLC they will construct a new line which bring power from Canada to southern New England. They will recover their cost and return on equity over a period of forty years. My question to KEMA is assuming that there is an entity that wants to develop a 200MW wind farm and assuming Northeast Utilities is willing to upgrade its Coos Loop could such a long-term lease arrangement as the one they will have with Hydro-Quebec be workable under the scenarios they envision in their report? It is unfortunate that we could not have discussed this with Dr. Wakefield on the 4th but we met a day early.

My thanks to everyone who has contributed their time and thoughts to this Commission which has been so important to the residents of Coos County.
