PETITION FOR LEAVE TO INTERVENE OF AT&T COMMUNICATIONS OF NEW ENGLAND, INC.

AT&T Communications of New England, Inc. ("AT&T"), with a business address of 99 Bedford Street, Suite 420,Boston, Massachusetts 02111, respectfully petitions for leave to intervene as a party to this proceeding pursuant to Order of Notice of the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission ("Commission"), dated June 23, 2006.

The grounds for this Petition are as follows:

1. AT&T is a common carrier of telecommunications services authorized by the Commission to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in New Hampshire and is also a certified competitive local exchange carrier ("CLEC").

2. As an interexchange carrier in the telecommunications market in New Hampshire, AT&T's interests are substantially and specifically affected because Verizon is charging AT&T access charges for terminating to wireless carriers in the same manner it is charging BayRing. As a result, a decision adverse to BayRing in this case would be detrimental to AT&T's interests and would have a significant and negative impact on

AT&T's costs in New Hampshire.

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3. No other party's participation can adequately represent the interests of

AT&T.

4. Further, AT&T's participation will enhance the Commission's

consideration of issues in this docket.
