I. BACKGROUND

Hampstead Area Water Company (HAWC), which serves approximately 2,900 customers in southeasterr New Hampshire, filed a petition on Ma.co 5, 2008 for approval of financing for proposed additions and upgrades to its system as well as for two additional wells. HAWC is seeking to borrow \$165,330 from its affiliate, Lewis Builders Development, Inc. (LBDI), in order to finance three distinct projects.

The first project involves SCADA system upgrades to facilities which will include Village Drive, the Shop Water Tank, and Pit Hatch in Atkinson and Colby Pond in Danville. HAWC anticipates that the installation of these upgrades will occur by year's end at an estimated cost of \$48,597. The second project involves the creation of a hydraulic system model as well as GIS water system mapping to analyze the interconnection of its Hampstead and Atkinson water systems. HAWC estimates the hydraulic system model will cost approximately \$45,000 and that the GIS system mapping will cost approximately \$39,000, for a combined cost of \$84,000. It anticipates that these items will be completed by year's end.

The third project, already completed, involved the drilling of two new wells in Atkinson at Bryant Woods and Dearborn Ridge to address supply issues at those systems. The cost of the Bryant Woods well was \$8,515 and the cost of the Dearborn Ridge well was \$24,218, for a total cost of \$32,733.

HAWC proposes that separate promissory notes from LBDI be issued. The note for the \$48,597 ScADA system upgrades will be payable over a term of ten years, the note for the hydraulic study and GIS model will be in the amount of \$84,000 and payable over a term of five years, and the note for the two new wells will be in the amount of \$32,733 and payable over a term of twenty years. HAWC originally indicated that each note would carry an interest rate of 8.25 percent, based on the prime rate as a proported in the

HAWC originally indicated that each note would carry an interest rate of 8.25 percent, based on the prime rate as reported in the Wall Street Journal at the time of HAWC's petition, 6.00 percent, plus an additional 2.25 percent. At the request of Commission Staff (Staff), HAWC agreed to revise the interest rate to 2.25 percent above the prime rate in effect as of the last day of the calendar quarter prior to the date of the issuance of the Commission's order in this docket and adjustable every three years thereafter. The prime rate in effect as of March 31, 2008 was 5.25 percent; thus the initial interest rate on the three notes would be 7.50 percent.

On June 11, 2008, Staff recommended approval of the petition, having concluded that the proposed uses for the financing were in the public interest. Staff further stated that the proposed terms of the fi-

We likewise conclude that the proposed financing terms are consistent with other HAWC financings approved by the Commission and will not have an unduly adverse impact on future customer rates. Lastly, we have determined that concerns about HAWC's capital structure are best addressed in the context of HAWC's upcoming rate case.

Based upon the foregoing, it is hereby ORDERED NISI, that subject to the effective date below, Hampstead Area Water Company, Inc.'s request for financing in an amount up to \$165,330 from Lewis Builders Development, Inc. under the terms and conditions discussed previously in this order is APPROVED; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that within thirty (30) days from the execution of the respective financings, HAWC shall file a copy of the executed promissory notes as well as any supporting documentation with the Commission; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that HAWC cause a copy of this Order Nisi to be published once in a statewide newspaper of general circulation or of circulation in those portions of the state where operations are conducted and shall send a copy of same to the town clerks of Hampstead, Atkinson and Danville, such actions to occur no later than June 30, 2008 and to be documented by affidavit filed with this office on or before July 21, 2008; and it is
