Re: DM 09-028 Freedom Energy Logistics, LLC's Filing Notice of Intent to Provide Electric Aggregation Services in New Hampshire: First Deficiency Letter

Dear Mr. Fromuth:

On February 18, 2009, the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission (Commission) received a notice of intent to provide electric aggregation services in New Hampshire from Freedom Energy Logistics, LLC (FEL). Staff has reviewed your application and has noted the following items which must be addressed before FEL can be registered as an aggregator:

Puc 2003.02 (c) (1) requires the "legal name of the aggregator as well as any trade name(s) under which it intends to operate in this state." FEL did not address the issue of a trade name. Please indicate whether or not FEL intends to operate under a trade name and provide that trade name(s) if that is the case.

Puc 2003.02 (c) (4) requires a "toll free telephone number of the customer service contact person". Please provide the Commission with a toll free number which can be used by customers.

Puc 2003.02 (c) (5) requires a "copy of the aggregator's authorization to do business in New Hampshire from the secretary of state". Please submit this authorization for FEL.

Puc 2003.02 (c) (7) requires a "statement that the aggregator is not representing any supplier interest or a listing of any supplier interest the aggregator intends to represent". FEL made no mention of this in its application. Please address this requirement.

Please address these discrepancies as soon as possible so that Staff may proceed with your request to register as an aggregator of electric services. Failure to respond in a timely

manner may result in the Commission dismissing, without prejudice, FEL's application. Also, please be advised that you should reference the docket number, DM 09-028, in all future correspondence with the Commission. Should you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me.
