### **ORDER OF NOTICE**

On April 17, 2009, Public Service Company of New Hampshire (PSNH) filed with the Commission a petition for temporary delivery rates pursuant to New Hampshire RSA 378:27, together with supporting testimony. The petition requests an order approving an increase in distribution revenues of \$36.4 million, or approximately 14%, to become effective as temporary rates on July 1, 2009. When compared to existing overall rates, the requested change to distribution revenues represents an average 3.0% increase across all rate classes. As described in the filing, the requested revenue increase consists of a revenue deficiency in actual costs based on a 2008 test year, certain other proforma changes to revenues and costs, and an amortization of PSNH's estimated costs incurred in connection with its response to the December 2008 ice storm. PSNH has designed the proposed temporary rates to ensure that all of the unbundled distribution rates for each customer class are adjusted on a uniform percentage basis.

According to the filing, during the month of May 2009 PSNH will be initiating changes to its Stranded Cost Recovery Charge (SCRC) and Default Energy Service Charge (ES) to be effective on July 1, 2009 that, combined with the requested temporary increase in distribution rates, are expected to result in an average decrease to overall retail electric service rates of 1.3%. This decrease is exclusive of any change in the Transmission Cost Adjustment Mechanism (TCAM) charge, which is also subject to adjustment on July 1 and will be the subject of a separate filing to be made in early June 2009. As part of PSNH's proposal, there is no net

change in overall revenue for the residential class in respect to the distribution, SCRC and ES rate components.

PSNH states that it anticipates filing its permanent delivery rate request in the near future.

PSNH also states that although it has not yet determined the amount of its permanent rate increase request, the rate level in the temporary rate request is less than the total revenue requirement adjustment to be sought in its permanent rate increase request. Under PSNH's proposal, the temporary rates will be reconciled to the final allowed permanent rate level, from the effective date of temporary rates to the future date on which permanent rates will be set.

PSNH reports that its actual earned return on equity for its delivery business in 2008 was approximately 6.26 percent, which it asserts is significantly below current and past industry standards of a fair and reasonable return and well below the 9.67% authorized by the Commission in PSNH's last rate case.

The filing raises, <u>inter alia</u>, issues related to whether the proposed temporary rates are just, reasonable and lawful as required by RSA 378:7 and whether the proposed rates yield a reasonable rate of return on the cost of PSNH's property that is prudent as well as used and useful in the public service less accumulated depreciation as required by RSA 378:27 and 28. Each party has the right to have an attorney represent them at their own expense.

# Based upon the foregoing, it is hereby

**ORDERED**, that a Prehearing Conference, pursuant to N.H. Admin. Rules Puc 203.15, be held before the Commission located at 21 S. Fruit St., Suite 10, Concord, New Hampshire on May 13, 2009 at 1:30 p.m., at which each party will provide a preliminary statement of its position with regard to the petition and any of the issues set forth in N.H. Code Admin. Rule Puc 203.15 shall be considered; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that, immediately following the Prehearing Conference, PSNH, the Staff of the Commission and any Intervenors hold a Technical Session to review the petition and allow PSNH to provide any amendments or updates to its filing; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that a hearing on the petition for temporary delivery rates be held before the Commission located at 21 S. Fruit St., Suite 10, Concord, New Hampshire on June 16, 2009 at 10:00 a.m.; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that pursuant to N.H. Admin. Rules Puc 203.12, PSNH shall notify all persons desiring to be heard at this hearing by publishing a copy of this Order of Notice no later than May 6, 2009, in a newspaper with general circulation in those portions of the state in which operations are conducted, publication to be documented by affidavit filed with the Commission on or before May 13, 2009; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that pursuant to N.H. Admin. Rules Puc 203.17, any party seeking to intervene in the proceeding shall submit to the Commission an original and eight copies of a Petition to Intervene with copies sent to PSNH and the Office of the Consumer Advocate on or before May 11, 2009, such Petition stating the facts demonstrating how its rights, duties, privileges, immunities or other substantial interest may be affected by the proceeding, as required by N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.17 and RSA 541-A:32,I(b); and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that any party objecting to a Petition to Intervene make said Objection on or before May 13, 2009.
