Dear Ms. Howland:

The purpose of this letter is to address the motions to intervene filed in this docket by TransCanada Power Marketing Ltd. (TransCanada), Freedom Logistics, LLC (Freedom) and Halifax-American Energy Company, LLC (Halifax). TransCanada said that, as an energy marketing entity, it moved to intervene to understand how Public Service Company of New Hampshire (PSNH) intended to address the rate impacts of customer migration as set forth in the filing and in the order of notice. Freedom and Halifax stated that they had filed motions to intervene for the same reason as TransCanada. The Office of Consumer Advocate supported the motions to intervene. Staff took no position.

Following a brief discussion, PSNH assented to the motions provided that the intervenors, who are competitors of PSNH, should not be allowed access to PSNH's confidential information.

Finally, PSNH agreed that it would file a proposal to address the rate impacts of customer migration on November 23, 2009, the date that Staff and intervenor testimony is due pursuant to the procedural schedule.
