

Dear Mr. Naylor,

Thank you for speaking with me last week. As we discussed on the telephone, please consider this letter a formal complaint against North Country Water Company on behalf of the Freedom Village Condominium Association.

North Country Water Company supplies all of the water for the 66 condominium units in the Association and has done that since at least 1988. Attached are two letters – one dated April 21, 2009 from Wendy Chase to Stanley Oliver the owner of North Country, and his reply dated May 11, 2009. Because of his threat to shut off the water, the Association has been paying the increased monthly rate of \$30.00 per unit. Mr. Oliver has continued to refuse to negotiate the rate or discuss the Association purchasing the water system.

North Country received an exemption from regulation by an Order from the PUC dated June 26, 1995. This exemption was based upon a finding that the service was adequate and that there was the "... ability of the association to negotiate directly with its water provider, ..." (see Order # 21,709; DE 93-197, page 3, second paragraph). Obviously, there is no such ability to negotiate with Mr. Oliver and we feel that continued exemption from regulation under RSA 362:4, I is not in the public interest and it certainly is not fair to the 66 owners at Freedom Village.

You should also be aware that many, if not the majority of the condominium units, are occupied seasonally and only use water for 6 months or less. In addition, because of the lack of maintenance by North Country, the Association has had to paint and put a new roof on the

pump house and remove trees that grew over the water tanks to keep the roots from breaching those tanks; they also plow access to the pump house, all with no contribution from North Country.

I would appreciate it if you can advise me of the next step in the process of the PUC addressing this situation. Any assistance your office or the Commission might provide will be appreciated.
