DE 10-024: Request to Approve FY16 program budgets

The Renewable Energy Fund (REF) is a dedicated, non-lapsing fund whose purpose is to support electrical and thermal renewable energy initiatives. In August 2015, the Sustainable Energy Division (SED) recommended the preliminary program allocations in Table 1, based on partially reconciled alternative compliance payments (ACPs) and the Commission's request to expend calendar year (CY) 2013 REF monies, for fiscal year 2016 (July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016).

This memorandum is to request approval to amend the program budgets for the REF managed by the SED for fiscal year (FY) 2016. Since August, the Commission has reconciled FY15 carry-forward balances and ACPs; thereby necessitating additional funds be allocated to the FY16 program budgets. Table 2 summarizes the revenues and proposed budget for the REF.

On August 6, 2015, the Commission released a preliminary program budget to spend \$6,940,199 in state fiscal year 2016 (July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016). On September 1, 2015, staff completed the reconciliation of carry-forward funds and the alternatives compliance payments, increasing the budget available for programs to by \$2,784,068 for a revised FY16 program budget of \$9,724,267, plus FY15 carry-forward monies. With Commission approval these funds will be allocated to programs as shown in Table 3.
