

On June 2, 2010, Holyoke Gas and Electric Department (HG&E or Applicant) of Holyoke, Massachusetts filed an application for certification of fourteen small hydroelectric facilities as sources eligible to produce renewable energy certificates (RECs) pursuant to RSA 362-F-4, the Electric Renewable Portfolio Star

On July 27, 2010, Staff filed a memorandum with the Commission recommending that the Commission deny the application. In that memorandum, Staff described the facilities as separately located facilities on a canal system in the City of Holyoke adjacent to the Connecticut River. According to Staff, some of the facilities share a FERC license number and a New England Power Pool Generation Information System facility code. Staff noted that the Applicant nevertheless maintained that each facility is physically and "electrically" separate and requested that each facility be accorded separate certification. Staff also noted that, although the application states that each facility has installed FERC required and approved upstream and downstream fish passages, responses to a Staff inquiry revealed that HG&E only installed a single upstream and downstream fish passage system at the Hadley Falls Station, which is located at the entrance of the canal system on which the fourteen facilities are located. Staff pointed out that New Hampshire's RPS law requires that an existing small hydroelectric facility has "actually installed both upstream and downstream diathomous fish passages and such installations have been approved by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission." See RSA 362-F-4, IV. Because there is only one upstream and downstream fish passage at the Hadley Falls Station, which serves all facilities located on the Canal, Staff recommended that the Commission deny certification of the fourteen facilities.

On August 12, 2010, based on the Information presented by HG&E and Staff's review and recommendation, the Commission denied certification of the HG&E facilities. On September 10, 2010, HG&E filed a motion for reconsideration or, in the alternative, a motion for rehearing of the Commission's decision. In its motion, HG&E stated that hydro facilities in the Holyok

tion to produce Class IV RECs.

The proper remedy for one aggrieved by a decision to deny REC certification is to petition the Commission to commence an adjudicative proceeding pursuant to N.H. Code Admin Rules Puc 2595.13, which states, in relevant part, that the Commission "shall conduct an adjudicative proceeding pursuant to RSA 541-A and Puc 200 upon petition by an applicant, source, or other party aggrieved by a decision under this part." In the interest of administrative efficiency, we will treat the HG&E motion for rehearing as such a petition and will commence an ad-

Based upon the foregoing, it is hereby
ORDERED, that an adjudicative proceeding is commenced pursuant to N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 2505.13; and it is

which operations are conducted, publication to be documented by affidiavit filed with the Commission on or before November 24, 2010; and it is
FURTHER ORDERED, that pursuant to N.H. Admin. Rules Puc 203.17, any party seeking to intervene in the proceeding shall submit to the
Commission seven copies of a Petition to Intervene with copies sent to HG&E and the Office of the Consumer Advocate on or before November 19, 2010, such Petition. stating the facts demonstrating how its rights, duties, privileges, immunities or other substantial interest may be
affected by the proceeding, as required by N.H. Admin. Rule Puc 203.17 and RSA 541-A:32, (b); and it is
FURTHER ORDERED, that any party objecting to a Petition to intervene make said Objection on or before November 24, 2010.
