2	CHAIRMAN GETZ: Okay. Good morning,

4	DE 11-255. On November 29, 2011, Public Service Company		
5	of New Hampshire filed a petition to revise its Renewable		
6	Energy Service Rate for service rendered on or after		
7	January 1, 2012. An order suspending the tariff and		
8	scheduling the prehearing conference for this morning was		
9	issued on December 15th.		
10	So, can we take appearances please.		
11	MR. EATON: For Public Service Company		
12	of New Hampshire, my name is Gerald M. Eaton. Good		
13	morning.		
14	CHAIRMAN GETZ: Good morning.		
15	MS. AMIDON: Good morning. Suzanne

CHAIRMAN GETZ: Good morning. So, appears to be no petitions to intervene. I guess we do have a letter of participation from the Office of Consumer Advocate. And, I'll note for the record that the affidavit of publication has been filed.

And, so, begin with Mr. Eaton, a

statement of position.

MR. EATON: I would like to begin by saying that there was a filing on December 23rd of an affidavit from the <u>Union Leader</u>, and they attached the actual advertisement for Pennichuck Water Works. We have a copy of the -- we have a copy of the actual ad back in our offices and we will file a substitute affidavit by the end of the day. And, so, the lack of participation isn't because the notice wasn't published.

The Company has filed revisions to our Renewable Energy Service Rate. It involves a rather sizeable increase, which we're willing to discuss with the Staff and the Office of Consumer Advocate about what can be done. Attorney Amidon pointed out a provision at RSA 374-F:3, V(f)(8), which allows the Company to substitute offering the rate by making alternative compliance payments to the fund, the Renewable Energy Fund. And, we'll explore that with the parties, given that it is quite a sizeable increase.

There's an offset between an overcollection and undercollection, which PSNH has proposed to carry forward until next year. It's rather small an amount.

But we will have a meeting with the

Staff next week and discuss these matters, again, with other utilities. It's kind of a generic meeting. And, then, we hope to have a hearing in the near future.

CHAIRMAN GETZ: Thank you. Ms. Amidon.

MS. AMIDON: Well, I think Mr. Eaton stole some of my thunder. But, having said that, the Staff has organized, and the OCA is aware of the meeting that we scheduled for next Friday. It will be a technical session, and we'll propose that in the procedural schedule following the prehearing conference today. At that time, we hope to hear from Unitil, National Grid, and PSNH. And, the intent is to review a couple of concerns that Staff has overall regarding the Renewable Service Option. The first of which is the low participation, and the second of which is the administrative costs and the marketing costs, which continue to have to be spent in order to get participation of any level at all.

We will consider this provision that Mr. Eaton referred to, which allows that, if the Renewable Default Service is not available at a reasonable cost, that a utility may, as approved by the Commission, make payments to the Renewable Energy Fund on behalf of customers who select the Renewable Energy Service Option. So, that will be one of the subjects that we explore next
