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1	A.	The proposed residential heating 2012 Summer Period rate of \$0.3371 per therm
2		is \$0.2823 per therm lower than the average 2011 Summer Period rate of \$0.6194
3		per therm. This is discussed in the testimony of Mr. Kahl.
4		
5	Q.	Have you prepared a typical bill analysis showing the impact of the proposed
6		changes for effect on May 1, 2012 on a typical residential gas heating
7		customer?
8	A.	Yes. Schedule 8 provides this analysis and shows the impact of the proposed
9		COG changes only; this analysis does not include any LDAC or distribution rate
10		changes that may result from Docket DG 11-069, Northern's base rate case that is
11		currently pending before the Commission. A typical residential heating customer
12		consuming 318 therms during the 2012 Summer Period will see a bill of \$310.61
13		for the entire Summer Period of May through October. This is \$85.91, or 21.67%
14		lower than the bill for the same usage during the 2011 Summer Period.
15		
16	Q.	Please give an update to the LDAC DSM component over-collection in
17		Docket DG 11-207.
18	А.	The Company has filed with the Commission its plan to spend all DSM carryover
19		funds as instructed by the Commission in Order 25,315 in Docket DE 10-188, the
20		2011-2012 CORE Natural Gas Energy Efficiency Programs.
