Dear Secretary Howland:

In Compliance with Order No. 24,893 dated September 15, 2008 in Docket DE 06-061 (Investigation into Implementation of Standards in the Energy Policy Act of 2005), Unitil Energy Systems, Inc. ("UES"), herewith files this response. In the Order, the affected utilities were ordered to complete work on a common draft tariff for interconnection of generating sources of up to 10 kVA and possibly inverter based sources up to 100 kVA as described in the Report of the Technical Session of April 25, 2008 filed on May 13, 2008, and to file utility specific tariffs based on such common draft by December 31, 2008.

In the existing tariff of UES, under the Terms and Conditions for Distribution Service, Section II. Distribution Services, 7. Customer's Installation, C. Standards for Interconnection, the following language appears:

"The Customer's installation shall conform to the requirements of the Company's Standards and/or such further requirements as the Company may promulgate from time to time. Copies of such requirements are available from the Company."

UES will incorporate into its Company Standards the draft language from the "Interconnection Standards for Inverters Sized up to 100 kVA" which was submitted to Commission Staff in October, 2008 by PSNH.
