CHAPTER Puc 1400 RULES FOR PIPE-LINE PUBLIC UTILITIES

PART Puc 1401 DEFINITIONS

Puc 1401.01 "Pipeline public utility.", "pipeline utility" or "utility" means any "public utility" as defined in RSA 362:2, owning or operating any pipeline, including pumping stations, storage depots and other facilities, for the transportation, distribution or sale of gas, crude petroleum, refined petroleum products, or combinations of petroleum products.

Puc 1401.02 "Commission" shall mean the New Hampshire public utilities commission.

PART Puc 1402 REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Puc 1402.01 Reports to Commission.

(a) If deemed necessary by the commission to fulfill its authority under RSA 374:3, eEach utility shall provide the commission, upon its request, the results of any required-tests and summaries of any required-records required under state or federal law.

(b) Each utility shall file reports with the commission on such forms as the commission shall specify as provided in Puc 1403.

(c) Copies of forms shall be furnished by the commission upon request.

PART 1403 FORMS TO BE FILED

Puc 1403.01 F-22 Information Sheet.

- (a) Each utility shall file Form F-22:
 - (1) Annually; and

(2) Whenever any changes occur to the information included in a utility's current Form F-22 filing.

- (b) Each utility shall include on form F-22 the following:
 - (1) Name of utility;
 - (2) Person's name and address to receive annual report form;

(3) Person's name and address to receive the utility assessment tax; and

(4) The names and titles of the principal officers of the company.

Puc 1403.02 Annual Report.

(a) Any owner or operator of a pipeline facility regulated by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission shall, with respect to any such pipeline facility located or to be located in New Hampshire, file with the commission:

(1) Annually, on or before April 30 of each year, a signed original of the <u>applicable</u> Federal Energy Regulatory Commission annual report form (<u>, Fform Naumber 2 or 2A</u>), pertaining to such facility; and

(2) Concurrently upon its filing with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, a copy of any application for a certification of public convenience and necessity under the Natural Gas Act, 15 U.S.C. § 717f(c), with respect to any pipeline facility of such owner or operator proposed to be located in New Hampshire.
