

Please note that Liberty has restructured Schedule 1, page 4, the allocation of Contract Termination Charge billed to the Company to individual rate classes, to be more consistent with the method used in allocations of other expense types. Rather than calculating the charge to each rate class using a "bottom-up" approach, the Company is now allocating total CTC expense to each rate class based on their contribution to total CTC revenue for the month.
