NOTICE OF SUBPOENA

On February 28, 2013, the Commission issued an Order of Notice, pursuant to RSA 541-A:31, setting hearings for March 20, 2013 and March 22, 2013; the March 20, 2013 hearing date has since been cancelled but the March 22, 2013 hearing remains. Pursuant to the Commission's authority in RSA 365:10, the Commission is exercising its power to subpoen witnesses in this proceeding.

To that end, FairPoint Energy, LLC is required to produce a witness or witnesses with knowledge of the issues listed below to appear before the N.H. Public Utilities Commission at 21 South Fruit Street, Suite 10, in Concord, New Hampshire on March 22, 2013 at 9:00 AM to testify relative to the above pending cases and relative to the issues listed below:

1. FairPoint Energy's knowledge of the chronology of events surrounding PNE's and Resident Power's attempted transfers of customers to FairPoint Energy, and of PNE's default, suspension, and termination at ISO-NE.

2. FairPoint Energy's knowledge of statements made by PNE and Resident Power and their representatives regarding PNE's ability to maintain financial assurance at ISO-NE during the transfer of customer accounts to FairPoint Energy. 3. The transfer and aborted transfer of customer accounts from competitive suppliers other than PNE to FairPoint Energy that occurred in conjunction with PNE's and Resident Power's attempted transfers of customers from PNE to FairPoint Energy.

4. Discussions FairPoint Energy had with PNE and Resident Power concerning aggregation of customers.

5. Discussions FairPoint Energy had with NHPUC staff regarding the transfer of customers from PNE and other competitive suppliers.
