Renewal of Registration to Provide Electric Aggregation Service

This is a correction and clarification to Staff's memo of December 5, 2013. On November 13, 2013, RJT Energy Consultants, LLC (RJT Energy) filed a renewal application to register as a provider of electric aggregation service, and not an initial application. In its current filing, RJT Energy apologized for not submitting its application timely, stating that this was due to an oversight. RJT Energy's current registration will have expired on December 5, 2013 if the renewal application is not approved.

Regarding the late filing, according to Puc 2003.05(f), RJT Energy's renewal application should have been filed at least 60 days prior to the expiration of the currently effective registration, on October 6, 2013. Because RJT Energy acknowledged it did not submit its renewal timely, and because this is the first time RJT Energy has been tardy with its submission to renew its registration for electric aggregation, Staff still recommends the Commission approve RJT Energy's renewal application as a provider of electric aggregation service, effective December 5, 2013, for a term of 5 years.
