Dear Mr. Pylpyczuk:

On July 09, 2014 the Commission received an email from Knollwood Energy of MA, LLC (Knollwood Energy) on behalf Sam Pylpyczuk (Pylpyczuk). Attached to the email was a letter signed by Sam Pylpyczuk requesting the transfer of REC eligibility for the Pylpyczuk photovoltaic array, from Solar Farm Bank, LLC (SFB), (NON 35889), to the Knollwood Energy aggregation, pursuant to Puc 2505.12. The Commission originally certified the Pylpyczuk photovoltaic array as a Class II renewable energy source effective as of March 3, 2014.

The nameplate capacity of the Pylpyczuk array is 0.00966 megawatts; the facility's new New England Power Pool (NEPOOL) Generation Information System facility code is NON 41564. Knollwood Energy was approved as an aggregator of New Hampshire customer-sited sources effective as of September 13, 2013¹, pursuant to Puc 2506.

Since the facility is a customer-sited source, its output is not recorded in the NEPOOL Market Settlement System and, as a result, its output must be monitored and verified by an independent monitor. Paul Button will continue to monitor the facility's output as required by the New Hampshire Code of Administrative Rules Puc 2505.08(b)(5).

Staff has reviewed the request for transfer of REC eligibility and recommends approval of the transfer. Based on Staff's recommendation, the Commission hereby approves the Pylpyczuk transfer to Knollwood Energy effective July 9, 2014.

Attached please find a copy of the notice of this transfer provided to the GIS administrator.

Please be advised that, pursuant to RSA 362-F, the Commission has approved the transfer of renewable energy certificate (REC) eligibility for the Sam Pylpyczuk (Pylpyczuk) photovoltaic (PV) facility from Solar Farm Bank, LLC (Solar Farm Bank) to the Knollwood Energy of MA, LLC (Knollwood Energy) aggregation.

Accordingly, Knollwood Energy is eligible to be issued Class II RECs, effective as of July 09, 2014 for the Pylpyczuk PV facility. The following table summarizes the new addition to Knollwood Energy's aggregation including the GIS Facility Code and the New Hampshire Certification Code.
