Summary

On October 20, 2014, the Commission received an application filed by Knollwood Energy of MA, LLC (Knollwood Energy) for Eaton Door and Frame (Eaton Door & Frame). Knollwood Energy is requesting Class II eligibility for Eaton Door & Frame's photovoltaic (PV) array expansion and continued inclusion in the Knollwood Energy aggregation. The Commission previously certified Eaton Door & Frame for a 0.03612 megawatt (MW) PV array effective as of June 4, 2014. The nameplate capacity for the system expansion is 0.018 for a total system nameplate capacity of 0.05412 MW.

The Commission, in a non-adjudicative process, is required to issue a determination of whether a facility meets a particular classification within 45 days of receipt of a completed application. The above-named facility is a customer-sited source and meets the Class II eligibility requirements under RSA 362-F:4, II. Based on review of the application, Staff recommends that the Commission certify the Eaton Door & Frame PV system expansion as an eligible facility for Class II RECs to be included as part of the Knollwood aggregation effective as of October 20, 2014.

Analysis

To qualify as a REC eligible facility, Puc 2505.08 (b) requires the source to provide the following information:

¹ Pursuant to RSA 362-F, New Hampshire's Electric Renewable Portfolio Standard law, Class II eligibility requires a facility to produce electricity from solar technologies that began operation after January 1, 2006 (RSA 362-F:4, II).

² The Commission granted Knollwood Energy the authority to aggregate customer-sited sources pursuant to Puc 2506 (DE 13-256).
