Summarv

On June 9, 2014, the Commission received applications filed by the New Hampshire Electric Cooperative (NHEC) requesting Class II eligibility for NHEC member photovoltaic (PV) arrays¹ and inclusion in the NHEC aggregation². The applicants include: Shepherds View Ranch, LLC (Shepherds View Ranch); Rick Hines (Hines); and Donald J. MacFarlane (MacFarlane).

On June 17, 2014, the Commission received additional applications filed by NHEC requesting Class II eligibility for NHEC member PV arrays and inclusion in the NHEC aggregation. These applicants include Eloise Coudert (Coudert), Brad McKenzie (McKenzie) and Bryan Turnbull (Turnbull).

The Commission, in a non-adjudicative process, is required to issue a determination of whether a facility meets a particular classification within 45 days of receipt of a completed application. The above-named customer-sited PV facilities were approved for operation by NHEC in 2014 and meet the Class II eligibility requirements under RSA 362-F:4, II. Based

on review of the applications, Staff recommends that the Commission certify the Shepherds View Ranch, Hines, and MacFarlane PV arrays as eligible facilities for Class II RECs to be included as part of the NHEC aggregation effective as of June 9, 2014. In addition, Staff recommends that the Commission certify the Coudert, McKenzie, and Turnbull PV arrays as eligible facilities for Class II RECs and inclusion in the NHEC aggregation effective as of June 17, 2014.

These facilities are customer-sited sources and therefore:

- The New England Independent System Operator asset identification number is not applicable;
- The output is not recorded in the New England Power Pool (NEPOOL) Market Settlement System; and,
- The output must be monitored and verified by an independent monitor (Puc 2505.09).

In addition to reporting each source's output to the Commission, NHEC will include the total output of these facilities when it reports the total output of all of its Class II eligible facilities, under the name *NHEC Class II Aggregation*, to the NEPOOL Generation Information System.

³ NHEC considers the operation date listed in the table above, and in Appendix E of each application, to be the date on which NHEC inspected each facility and installed a revenue quality meter to record the electricity that will be eligible for Class II RECs. The date listed in each interconnection application pertains to the installation and interconnection of the facility and may be different than the operation date listed in the above table.

As the distribution utility, NHEC provided a copy of the approved interconnection agreements for these facilities. In addition, signed attestations approving the installation, operation and conformance with any applicable building codes were provided for each facility.

Recommendation

Staff has reviewed NHEC's applications for the photovoltaic arrays located at the above-named facilities and can affirm all are complete pursuant to Puc 2505.08. Staff recommends that the Commission certify the Shepherds View Ranch, Hines, and MacFarlane PV arrays as Class II REC eligible facilities to be included as part of the NHEC aggregation effective as of June 9, 2014. Further, Staff recommends the Coudert, McKenzie, and Turnbull facilities be certified as Class II REC eligible facilities to be included in the NHEC aggregation effective as of June 17, 2014.
