**PETITION FOR INTERVENTION OF FREEDOM LOGISTICS LLC**

Dear Ms. Howland:

This is a brief response to the Objection of Liberty Utilities to the Petition for Intervention of Freedom Logistics LLC ("FEL"). Liberty's Objection first came to my attention late yesterday since, to the best of my knowledge, I was not served with an electronic copy as required by Rule Puc 203.11.

FEL has not issued any Data Requests in this proceeding, nor does it intend to provide any testimony.

The issue that FEL intends to explore pertains to the key differences between Liberty's proposal to provide default service to large customers and the corresponding Commission-approved methodology currently being used by Unitil to resolve the same issues identified by Liberty. Unitil's approach appears to be superior to that proposed by Liberty and since it has already been vetted and approved by the Commission it should be, at a minimum, considered.

In closing, although not mentioned by Liberty, the Commission may allow intervention by any party if it deems such intervention in the public interest.
