2014-2015 Winter Period Cost of Gas Adjustment

ORDER OF NOTICE

On September 5, 2014, New Hampshire Gas Corporation (NHGC), a public utility providing propane air service to approximately 1,110 customers in Keene, New Hampshire, filed revisions to its tariff providing its cost of gas (COG) rates for the winter period, November 1, 2014, through April 30, 2015. The proposed COG rate is \$1.7069 per therm, a \$0.3023 per therm decrease from the weighted average COG rate of \$2.0092 per therm for last winter. NHGC also proposed a \$1.7269 per therm rate for its fixed price option program (FPO) (a \$0.02 per therm premium over the non-FPO rate).

The cumulative effect of the COG adjustment and expiration of the Deferred Revenue Surcharge (\$0.0617 per therm) for a typical residential heating customer is that this winter's gas bill, for non-FPO customers, is expected to be \$1,571 compared to a total bill of \$1,767 for last winter, a decrease of approximately \$196, or 11 NHGC also requests a waiver from N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 1203.05, in order to implement the rate change on a bills-rendered basis.
